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The primary focus, in my opinion, should be on how to deliver the most amount of bandwidth to everyone, whether they are in a metropolitan area or 500 miles from "anywhere" else. We are 50 miles from the next largest city and although our connection to the county office of education is good, it needs to be better. We have a 1Gbps Point-to-Point connection between our school sites, but I would like to have it even faster. We just cannot afford it. If one wants to see how to take care of their school districts, take a look at how North Carolina handles their school districts. The school districts pay NOTHING for connectivity. The state picks up the tab for connections to the district's ISP of choice and pays for connectivity between the school sites. The speed is automatically adjusted based on need. School districts' speeds are monitored and when they reach a certain threshold, the speed is automatically adjusted to accommodate their needs. This is NOT what is happening in California and school districts are starving for connectivity!! If unfunded mandates continue to be rolled out, we cannot keep up with the demand for more speed.
