I am requesting that the FCC reclassifies Internet Service Providers as Title II common carriers. The USA is founded on principles of equality and freedom. These foundational concepts need to be applied to the internet particularly as we as a society move forward with technological advances. The internet is vital to society and this uniquely creative and open marketplace must remain a place for all of us regardless of deep pockets and political connections.

A Declaration of Interdependence:

When in the Course of internet applications, it becomes necessary for one person to use the bandwidth which has connected them equally with another, and to assume among the powers of the Web, the separate and equal station to which the Laws of Internet should entitle them, a decent respect to the opinions of citizens requires that the FCC should declare all internet users equal without separation.

We hold these truths to be self-evident, that the internet is vital to society, all data should be treated equally, that all users are endowed with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life online, Liberty of use and the Pursuit of Information and Networking in equal measure without discriminating or charging differentially by user, content, site, platform, application, type of attached equipment, and modes of communication.

We must secure these rights, that the internet remain free and equal not subject to the will of those with more money and political connections, That whenever the FCC becomes destructive of these ends, it is the Right of the People to voice their opinions and be heard and acted upon accordingly, any Internet Governing Rules must be laying its foundation on such principles and organizing its powers in such form, as to promote and maintain a standard of Access Freedom and Equality in matters so vital to society.

We, therefore, the Common Users of the Internet, in General opinions Assembled on this forum have declared, That the Internet is, and of Right ought to be Free and Independent, a Common Carrier Absolved from all Allegiance to those with Deep Pockets and Political Connection and that a Free and Independent Internet shall remain a marketplace of ideas and of free speech with a firm reliance on the equal protection to do all acts and things which the Internet may now or in the future do.
