

Dear Secretary Dortch,

Pursuant to section 1.1206 of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. § 1.1206, governing permit-but-disclose proceedings, this letter is to document an *ex parte* meeting that occurred between Chairman TJ Greene of the Makah Tribe, along with Todd Bertosen and Megan Delany of Dentons US LLP, and Rebekah Douglas of the Consumer and Governmental Affairs Bureau's Office of Native Affairs (ONAP) on July 13th.

During the meeting, Chairman Greene discussed the need for high-speed telecommunications services for schools, health care facilities and residents. Discussions included potential funding in universal service program, including E-Rate, Lifeline, Rural Health Care, and the Connect America Fund. The discussion also included efforts to enhance the internet speed to anchor institutions through the use via a microwave link and eventually through a fiber connection. Chairman Greene also related the Tribe's experience with Century Link as its carrier and the level of compliance with the Tribal Engagement Obligation. The Makah Tribe also shared the attached documents with Ms. Douglas.
