On June 18, 2014, Maggie Wilderotter, Chairman and CEO of Frontier Communications, Dan McCarthy, President and COO of Frontier Communications, and I met with Commissioner Mignon Clyburn and Rebekah Goodheart, Legal Advisor-Wireline to Commissioner Clyburn, and Sharon Lin, Intern for Commissioner Clyburn.

In the meeting Frontier discussed the numerous public interest benefits that would result from Frontier's proposed acquisition of The Southern New England Telephone Company ("SNET") from AT&T. Frontier discussed its commitment to broadband in Connecticut and how its local engagement model will benefit the residents of Connecticut. Frontier urged the Commission to complete its review of this proposed acquisition expeditiously.

Frontier also discussed its successes to date in deploying broadband across rural America using funding from Phase I of the Connect America Fund ("CAF"). Frontier also discussed the need to ensure that the CAF Phase II framework recognizes the costs and challenges of deploying broadband to extremely rural, high-cost locations.

Finally, Frontier discussed its support of an open internet but maintained that regulating broadband service as a Title II service would stifle investment and innovation.
