If the internet gets a fast lane and a slow lane (or as some might call it, a fast lane and a hyperspeed lane) - the content provided can literally be censored by speed. If a site that is 2 megabytes in size is pushed to 5 megabits (which is equal to 0.625 megabytes) download speed it will take more than 3.2 seconds to download each page whereas a competitor's site might be bumped to 50 megabits and download in less than one second.

It is very likely that the major players in the internet space are guilty of anti-trust violations and extortion and legalizing such behavior as allowing the ISPs to identify content and change the download/upload rate of that content is something to expect in a country that doesn't have morals or free trade.

I urge you to support Net Neutrality to exist in full scope and not allow ISPs to conspire to extort smaller companies into paying a ransom for the freedom to compete online.
