Pursuant to the requirements of Section 1.1206 of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. § 1.1206, Alaska Communications Systems ("ACS") hereby discloses that, on June 23 and 24, 2014, representatives of ACS met in separate meetings with (1) Commissioner Michael O'Rielly and his Legal Advisor, Amy Bender; (2) Daniel Alvarez, Legal Advisor to Chairman Tom Wheeler; (3) Rebekah Goodheart, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Mignon Clyburn; (4) Nicholas Degani, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Ajit Pai; (5) Priscilla Delgado Argeris, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Jessica Rosenworcel; and (6) Carol Matthey, Katie King, Alex Minard, Ian Forbes and Mark Walker of the Wireline Competition Bureau.

ACS representatives participating in the meeting were Leonard Steinberg, General Counsel, Karen Brinkmann, of Karen Brinkmann PLLC, and the undersigned. The materials attached to this letter were distributed in some of the meetings.

In the meetings, ACS discussed the Commission's opportunity to maximize the public interest benefits of Connect America Fund ("CAF") high cost support in Alaska by designing service obligations that are tailored to the needs of the state to accompany the continuation of high-cost support at the current CAF Phase I frozen support level. The discussion responded to the questions raised in the Commission's recent Further Notice of Proposed Rulemaking in the above-referenced dockets.

In the meetings with Commissioner O'Rielly and Ms. Bender, Ms. Goodheart, and Ms. Argeris, ACS representatives also suggested that the Commission should ensure that sufficient E-rate funding is available to support deployment of broadband service that has sufficient capacity to handle the increased volume of data that its investment in internal wi-fi connections will generate, as well as wired infrastructure upgrades within the school or library to ensure that these institutions are able to use voice over Internet protocol services as support for circuit-switched voice is phased out.
