Thank you so much for the invitation to the meeting with the Chairman. Preserving an open Internet is extremely important to Dropbox and our employees. As you are aware, we joined a letter with 150 other companies explaining that we are concerned by the FCC's proposal, and agree that permitting ISPs to discriminate technically and financially represents a grave threat to the Internet. We also urged the FCC to reverse course and adopt a rule against discrimination.

We are encouraged to see that the FCC is eager to discuss this important issue with us and others in the tech community. Unfortunately, Drew Houston, our CEO, is simply not available that day. The two other executives who would be appropriate for a meeting with the FCC Chairman, including me, will also be out of the country this entire week. Therefore, we must regrettably decline the invitation, despite our company's deep interest in the issue.
