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There should be an outright ban on fast lanes for content, because a fast lane for some content is the same as a slow lane for other content. Broadband access should be classified as a Title II common carrier like other important utilities (WSIS/UN considers internet access a right). Open Internet provisions should also cover wireless (mobile) broadband.

This is important because media and the free press/dissemination of information is critical to a functional democracy, and most journalism now exists on the internet. It is also important for free and fair market competition between service providers on the internet (like Netflix and Hulu).

I would like to see new FCC rules that there can be no "fast-lanes" or "slow-lanes" for any content for any reason. Also, it should be against the rules for MY ISP to charge money to content providers I'm accessing for bandwidth, I've already paid for that bandwidth. Lastly all types of internet access (DSL, cable, fiberoptic, etc) should be classified as Title II utilities with the same restrictions on fees as other utilities like power and water.
