Dear Madam Secretary,

The rule change regarding the 5725-5850 MHz band will drastically impact our ability to provide rural broadband by increasing equipment cost and diminishing effective range and throughput. Many of our existing customers may be denied service because of the rule change. The changes limiting spectrum, power, and antennas will require a more dense deployment. This, along with the increased cost of equipment, will cause the price of service to rise significantly. All of these consequences seem counter to the FCC's stated goals in many different rulings to increase the availability of affordable broadband to rural Americans.

Please help us support rural broadband and reverse this ruling.
