Dear FCC,

My name is Jesse Windle and I live in Durham, NC.

Net neutrality, the principle that Internet service providers (ISPs) treat all data that travels over their networks equally, is important to me because without it ISPs could have too much power to determine my Internet experience by providing better access to some services but not others.

A pay-to-play Internet worries me because ISPs could act as the gatekeepers to their subscribers.

I am a post doctoral associate in statistics at Duke University. I have a computer at home and a computer at school. On both computers, I do computations for various statistical models. The output of my computer simulations are rather large in terms of bytes used. Sometimes it is useful to transfer the output of these simulations or other data from my computer at home to my computer on campus or visa versa. I am concerned that eliminating net neutrality will harm my ability to easily and cheaply do work across multiple workstations. In particular, I worry that I may have to pay more to exchange data between computers or because the rate at which this data is transferred is throttled.
