Telcordia Technologies, Inc., d/b/a iconectiv (“Telcordia”) hereby responds to Neustar’s letter of July 21, 2014, which reiterates Neustar’s request for access to the national-security-related information that was redacted from Telcordia’s bid documents. As explained previously, Telcordia redacted this information from its bid documents at the direction of the Commission, which determined that the redactions were necessary in order to protect the national security. If the Commission determines that releasing the redacted information to outside counsel for Neustar will not endanger the national security, Telcordia does not object to making this information available to outside counsel for Neustar who are qualified to view Highly Confidential Information under the terms of the Revised Protective Order.

Telcordia strongly opposes any additional delay in the comment period, however. Neustar has had ample time to prepare its comments. To the extent the Commission determines that it is appropriate for Neustar to gain access to this information, Neustar can include that commentary with its reply comments, and Telcordia could file any response thereafter. There is no need to delay the entire comment process.

The public has waited long enough for a final determination of the next LNPA. Neustar will no doubt continue to seek delays in an effort to force an extension of its incumbent contract under which it receives nearly \$500 million per year—which would be a horrendous waste of providers’ and consumers’ money. Moving forward expeditiously with LNPA selection and completing the LNPA transition by July 1, 2015 is manifestly in the public interest, as the North American Numbering Council (“NANC”) unanimously concluded and as is documented by the reports transmitted by NANC to the FCC along with its selection recommendation.
