**NON-STREAMLINED APPLICATION FOR TRANSFER OF CONTROL
OF DOMESTIC BLANKET SECTION 214 AUTHORIZATIONS**

The forty-eight Shareholders of Goldfield Telephone Co., Inc. represented by Darrell Seaba, as attorney in fact (“Transferor”) and BYC Communications, LLC (“BYC” or “Transferee”; FRN: 002-37708-37) hereby request Commission authorization for the transfer of control of Goldfield Telephone Co., Inc. (“GTCI”; FRN: 0002-5958-74) and Goldfield Access Network, L.C. (“GAN”; FRN: 0004-0566-44) which provide interstate interexchange and exchange access services as an incumbent local exchange carrier (“ILEC”) and a competitive local exchange carrier (“CLEC”), respectively, in the State of Iowa pursuant to blanket domestic Section 214 authorizations, from the Shareholders of GTCI to BYC.

GTCI is an Iowa corporation that provides local exchange service and exchange access service as an ILEC, as well as long distance toll services, in the Goldfield exchange in Wright County in rural north central Iowa. GAN is an Iowa limited liability company that provides local

exchange service and exchange access service as a CLEC in competition with CenturyLink, as well as long distance toll services, in the Clarion, Eagle Grove, Humboldt and Renwick exchanges in Wright and Humboldt Counties in rural north central Iowa.

BYC is a recently formed Iowa limited liability company that is owned in equal 33.33 percent portions by three Iowa ILECs: (1) Communications 1 Network, Inc. ("Comm1"); (2) Schaller Telephone Company ("Schaller"); and (3) Webster-Calhoun Cooperative Telephone Association ("WCCTA"). Comm1 provides local exchange, exchange access and long distance toll services in the Corwith, Kanawha and Klemme exchanges in Hancock County in rural north central Iowa. Schaller provides local exchange, exchange access and long distance toll services in the Schaller, Galva, Cushing and Kiron exchanges in Sac, Ida, Woodbury and Crawford Counties in rural west central Iowa. WCCTA provides local exchange, exchange access and long distance toll services in the Gowrie, Pilot Mound, Vincent, Thor, Churdan, Knierim, Somers, Barnum, Duncombe, Farnhamville, Badger, Clare, Moorland, Boxholm, Lanyon and Paton exchanges in Webster, Calhoun, Greene, Boone and Humboldt Counties in rural north central Iowa.

This application does not qualify for streamlined processing. WCCTA's Thor exchange is adjacent to GTCI's Goldfield exchange, and WCCTA's Thor, Badger, Vincent and Clare exchanges are adjacent to one or more of GAN's Humboldt, Renwick and Eagle Grove exchanges. In addition, Comm1's Kanawha exchange is adjacent to GTCI's Goldfield exchange, and Comm1's Kanawha and Corwith exchanges are each adjacent to GAN's Renwick exchange.

Webster-Calhoun Cooperative Telephone Association (Before and After Transaction)

Webster-Calhoun Cooperative Telephone Association is a telephone cooperative which has approximately 3,199 members, none of whom directly or indirectly owns or controls ten (10) percent or more of its equity or voting power.

No other individual or entity will directly or indirectly own or control at least ten (10) percent of the equity or voting power of Goldfield Telephone Co., Inc. or Goldfield Access Network, LC after the proposed transaction.

(5) Certification pursuant to 47 C.F.R. §§1.2001 through 1.2003 that no party to the application is subject to denial of Federal benefits pursuant to section 5301 of the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1988.

Darrell Seaba, Attorney in Fact for the 48 Shareholders of GTCI, and BYC hereby certify, pursuant to 47 C.F.R. §§1.2001 through 1.2003, that no party to the present application is subject to denial of Federal benefits pursuant to section 5301 of the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1988.

(6) Description of the transaction:

BYC is purchasing all of GTCI's issued and outstanding common stock (GTCI's only class of stock) from GTCI's forty-eight existing stockholders. Purchase of this stock will give BYC control of GTCI and its assets, operations and subsidiaries, including GTCI's blanket domestic Section 214 authorization.

BYC's purchase of GTCI's stock will also give BYC ownership of GTCI's controlling 51.00 percent equity interest in GAN, plus a 25.00 percent equity interest in Goldfield Telecom, L.C. ("GTLC"), an Iowa limited liability company that is a telecommunications equipment supplier. The remaining 49.00 equity interest in GAN is currently held by Advanced Telecommunications Holdings ("ATH"), an Iowa corporation that is also a telecommunications equipment supplier. ATH is currently owned 100.00 percent by Darrell Seaba, the present General Manager and 21.80 percent shareholder of GTCI. As part of the transaction, GTCI will exchange its 25.00 percent interest in GTLC to ATH for ATH's 49.00 percent interest in GAN. As a result of this exchange, GTCI and its new parent entity BYC will own 100.00 percent of the equity and voting interests of GAN, and consequently will own and control GAN's blanket domestic Section 214 authorization.

(7) Description of the geographic areas in which the transferor and transferee (and their affiliates) offer domestic telecommunications services, and what services are provided in each area:

Areas and Services of Goldfield Telephone Co., Inc., Goldfield Access Network, L.C. and Affiliates.

GTCI provides local exchange service and exchange access service as an ILEC in the Goldfield exchange (less than 500 access lines) in Wright County in rural north central Iowa. In addition to local telephone service and custom calling features, GTCI offers long distance toll services, dial-up and high-speed [over digital subscriber lines ("DSL")] Internet access services to Goldfield area customers.

GAN provides local exchange service and exchange access service as a CLEC in competition with CenturyLink, in the Clarion, Eagle Grove, Humboldt and Renwick exchanges (less than 3,500 access lines) in Wright and Humboldt Counties in rural north central Iowa. In addition to local telephone service and custom calling features, GAN offers long distance toll services, dial-up and high-speed (over DSL) Internet access services to Clarion, Eagle Grove, Humboldt and Renwick area customers.

Goldfield Communications Services, Corp., an Iowa corporation owned 100.00 percent by GTCI, provides cable television service in the communities of Goldfield, Woolstock and Badger, Iowa. It also sells, installs and repairs telephone and key systems, and serves as an affiliated dealer and/or contracted sales agent for wireless telecommunications services provided by Iowa Wireless Services, L.L.C.

North Central Wireless, L.C., an Iowa limited liability company that is a wholly owned subsidiary of GTCI, is the licensee of Personal Communications Service Stations WPTJ814, WQGL345 and WQND996, which provide wireless telecommunications services in Wright and Humboldt Counties in rural north central Iowa through a contractual affiliation arrangement with Iowa Wireless Services, L.L.C.

GTCI holds a 25.00 percent ownership interest in Goldfield Telecom, L.C., an Iowa limited liability company that sells wholesale telecommunications equipment. As indicated above, GTCI's interest in GTLC is, as part of the subject transaction, being exchanged for Advanced Telecommunications Holdings' 49.00 percent interest in GAN.

GTCI and GAN have no ownership interests in any other entity that offers domestic telecommunications services.

Areas and Services of BYC Investments, LLC

BYC was formed recently as an Iowa limited liability company to acquire GTCI and GTCI's subsidiaries and affiliates. BYC has no ownership interests at this time in any other entity that offers domestic telecommunications services.

Areas and Services of Communications 1 Network, Inc. and Affiliates

Comm1 provides local exchange and exchange access services as an ILEC in the Corwith, Kanawha and Klemme exchanges (less than 1,200 access lines) in Hancock County in rural north central Iowa. In addition to local telephone service and custom calling features, Comm1 offers long distance toll services, digital cable television service, and high-speed Internet access services to Corwith, Kanawha, Klemme, Britt and Garner area customers.

Comm1 owns a 100.00 percent interest in Comm 1 Connects, Inc., an Iowa corporation that provides CLEC services in Britt and Garner, Iowa.

Comm1 owns a 100.00 percent interest in Comm 1 Wireless, Inc., an Iowa corporation that provides wireless services in Corwith, Kanawha, Klemme, Britt and Garner, Iowa.

Comm1 owns a 11.11 percent interest in Southern Minnesota Broadband LLC, a Minnesota limited liability company that plans to provide ethernet services to residents in Southern Minnesota.

Comm1 has no ownership interests in any other entity that offers domestic telecommunications services.

Areas and Services of Schaller Telephone Company and Affiliates

Schaller provides local exchange, exchange access and long distance toll services in the Schaller, Galva, Cushing and Kiron exchanges (less than 2,000 access lines) in Sac, Ida, Woodbury and Crawford Counties in rural west central Iowa. In addition to local telephone service and custom calling features, Schaller offers long distance toll services, high-speed Internet access (over DSL) services, and cable television service in and around Schaller, Galva, Cushing and Kiron, Iowa.

Schaller owns a 50.00 percent member interest in Advanced Network Communications, LLC, an Iowa limited liability company that provides local exchange and exchange access services as a CLEC, plus long distance toll and Internet access services, in Correctionville, Ida Grove, Holstein and Anthon, Iowa.

Schaller owns a 15.00 percent limited partnership interest in Iowa RSA No. 9 Limited Partnership, an Iowa limited partnership that provides cellular wireless services in Greene, Carroll, Calhoun, Sac, and Ida Counties in Iowa.

Schaller has no ownership interests in any other entity that offers domestic telecommunications services.

Areas and Services of Webster-Calhoun Cooperative Telephone Association and Affiliates

WCCTA provides local exchange and exchange access services as an ILEC in the Gowrie, Pilot Mound, Vincent, Thor, Churdan, Knierim, Somers, Barnum, Duncombe, Farnhamville, Badger, Clare, Moorland, Boxholm, Lanyon and Paton exchanges (less than 4,000 access lines) in Webster, Calhoun, Greene, Boone and Humboldt Counties in rural north central Iowa. In addition to local telephone service and custom calling features, WCCTA offers long distance toll services, high-speed Internet access services, and IPTV high definition digital television services in all sixteen exchanges. WCCTA serves as an affiliated dealer and/or contracted sales agent for wireless telecommunications services provided by Iowa Wireless Services, L.L.C.

WCCTA owns a 100.00 percent interest in Webster-Calhoun Long Distance, Inc., an Iowa corporation that resells domestic and international long distance toll services in all sixteen of WCCTA's local exchange service areas.

WCCTA owns a 12.33 percent interest in Alpine Communications, L.C., an Iowa limited company that provides telephone, cable television, and internet services in Northeast Iowa.

WCCTA owns a 50.00 percent member interest in Hamilton County Wireless, LLC, an Iowa limited liability company that provides wireless services in Hamilton County, Iowa.

WCCTA owns a 24.99 percent limited partnership interest in Iowa RSA No. 9 Limited Partnership, an Iowa limited partnership that provides cellular wireless services in Greene, Carroll, Calhoun, Sac, and Ida Counties in Iowa.

WCCTA has no ownership interests in any other entity that offers domestic telecommunications services.

(8) Statement as to how the application fits into one or more of the presumptive streamlined categories in section 63.03 or why it is otherwise appropriate for streamlined treatment:

Due to Comm1's and WCCTA's adjacent service areas with GTCI and GAN, this application does not fit within the presumptive streamlined categories in Section 63.03(b) of the Commission's Rules, and streamlined treatment is not requested.

Applicants note that Comm1, Schaller, WCCTA, GTCI, GAN and their affiliates are all small rural Iowa RLECs and CLECs with an aggregated market share in the interstate, interexchange market of substantially less than 10 percent. In addition, Comm1, Schaller, WCCTA, GTCI, GAN and their affiliates have, in combination, far fewer than two percent of the nation's subscriber lines installed in the aggregate nationwide.

(9) Identification of all other Commission applications related to the same transaction:

The Applicants will file electronic applications via the International Bureau Filing System for transfer of control of the International Section 214 authorization for global resale of switched services held by Goldfield Communications Services, Corp. (ITC-214-19970811-00481).

The Applicants will also file applications for transfer of control of the licenses of Personal Communications Service Stations WPTJ814, WQGL345 and WQND996 held by North Central Wireless, L.C., and of Conventional Industrial/Business Pool Service station KNAI572 held by GTCI.

(10) Statement of whether the applicants are requesting special consideration because either party to the transaction is facing imminent business failure:

No party to the transaction is facing imminent business failure at this time. Therefore, the applicants are not requesting special consideration because a party to the transaction is facing imminent business failure.

(11) Identification of any separately filed waiver requests being sought in conjunction with the transaction:

No separately filed waivers or waiver requests are being sought in conjunction with the proposed transaction.

(12) Statement showing how grant of the application will serve the public interest, convenience and necessity, including any additional information that may be necessary to show the effect of the proposed transaction on competition in domestic markets:

The proposed transaction entails the acquisition of GTCI and GAN by a limited liability company comprised of three rural local exchange carriers that have long owned and operated local exchange, exchange access and long distance toll services in the rural areas of central and north central Iowa. Comm1, Schaller and WCCTA have long and proven records of investing in their rural networks and communities, and of providing high-quality, state-of-the-art voice, data and video services at affordable rates to their rural service areas. The proposed transaction will ensure that Goldfield, Clarion, Eagle Grove, Humboldt and Renwick area customers will continue to receive high-quality, state-of-the-art voice, data and video services at affordable rates during the foreseeable future.

Conclusion


