On Friday, July 25, 2014, Dr. Tom Leighton, Chief Executive Officer, Melanie Haratunian, Executive Vice President, General Counsel & Corporate Secretary, and Lauren Van Wazer, Vice President, Global Public Policy, all of Akamai Technologies, Inc. (Akamai), and the undersigned met separately with: (1) Chairman Wheeler, General Counsel Jonathan Sallet, Senior Counselor Phil Verveer and Legal Advisor Dan Gonzalez; (2) Commissioner Clyburn and Wireline Legal Advisor Rebekah Goodheart; (3) Commissioner Rosenworcel and Legal Advisor Priscilla Argeris; (4) Commissioner Pai and Wireless, Public Safety, and International Advisor Brendan Carr; and (5) Commissioner O’Rielly and Wireline Legal Advisor Amy Bender.

At each meeting, Akamai provided an overview of the company and the role it plays in the Internet ecosystem. During Akamai’s meetings with the Chairman, Commissioner Clyburn and Commissioner Pai, Akamai, expressed its support (as reflected in its comments in this proceeding) for continuing the differentiated treatment between wireline and mobile wireless broadband services in order to allow new solutions to address spectrum congestion to develop. In its meeting with Commissioner Clyburn, Akamai also confirmed the position in its comments that Section 706 is the preferred legal framework for any Open Internet rules.
