Dear Ms. Dortch:

On August 12, 2014, I spoke with Joel Rabinovitz and Michele Ellison of the Office of General Counsel on behalf of Telcordia Technologies, Inc., d/b/a iconectiv (“Telcordia”). On August 13, 2014, Rear Adm. Jamie Barnett (ret.) of Venable LLP spoke with Allan Manuel of the Public Safety and Homeland Security Bureau. In each of these conversations, we respectively stated that Mr. Barnett’s preliminary review of the security-redacted portions of Neustar’s ex parte dated August 5, 2014¹ and comments filed on July 25, 2014² did not appear to contain much, if any, material that should be classified, or considered proprietary to Neustar. Thus, to the extent that this information may be sensitive, some limits on public disclosure may be desirable, but there does not appear to be a reasonable justification for withholding this material from Telcordia or its outside counsel and consultants, irrespective of security clearances.
