



6. The Cable Modem 15.0 Plan has a round trip network latency requirement of 100 ms or less, as set forth in the Affidavit of Paul Dowling.

7. GCI offers the Cable Modem 15.0 Plan for \$59.99 per month when bundled with another service or \$69.99 per month when offered on a standalone basis, with a two year term commitment, in all census blocks included in GCI's challenge except those in Sitka. The Sitka locations are an off-the-road system and were previously served only by microwave backhaul, leading to a slight price increase to \$69.99 per month for bundled service and \$79.99 per month for standalone service in those census blocks. All locations incur an additional \$5 per month if purchased on a month to month basis. GCI's rates in the challenged census blocks are reasonably comparable to rates in urban areas. GCI offers the same services in Anchorage, an urban area that is located within a Metropolitan Statistical Area, as it does in the non-urban areas included in its challenge and at the same rates with the exception of Sitka, as described above. *See* GCI Marketing Materials at Attachment 1 to the Affidavit of Emily Thatcher; GCI Sample Invoices at Attachment 2 to the Affidavit of Emily Thatcher.

8. GCI competes with Alaska Communications Systems ("ACS"), a price-cap carrier, throughout Alaska. GCI's rates for its Cable Modem 15.0 Plan and other plans with a usage cap of 100 GB or higher, are lower than ACS' plans with similar speeds. For example, ACS' residential plan that offers customers a 15 Mbps download speed and 1.0 Mbps upload speed is \$119 per month. ACS packages do not have a usage cap. When compared head to head, GCI's services of at least 100 GB included usage are both capable of higher speeds and are more affordable than those of ACS.
