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. I am totally opposed to the proposed merger of Comcast and Time Warner Cable. For many years after moving here I had cable service from Time Warner, and HATED their overpriced services and the overall poor experience of utilizing their network--but at that time, I had no other options. A few years ago my neighborhood finally got fiber optic service via AT&T and I decided to switch--and I could not have been more happy with the change! My TV picture was far better, the service was far more reliable, and I found AT&T's customer service to be far more responsive to my needs than Time Warner ever was. The internet service is also MUCH more prone to slowdowns, too, that I did not experience on AT&T.
