Dear Ms. Dortch:

On May 28, 2014, the Commission's Office of Engineering and Technology (OET) began a 45-day public trial of the expanded registration facilities for Google's TV bands database system.¹ This trial allowed the public to access and test the Google's registration facilities to ensure that it properly registers facilities entitled to protection as specified in the rules. On July 28, 2014, Google provided the Commission a report summarizing the trial results.² OET then invited public comment on the trial and Google's report. The initial comment period closed on August 13, 2014, and no party raised any concerns about the trial or the operation of Google's registration facilities.

We look forward to working with Commission staff to answer any outstanding questions and obtain Commission approval of the change in registration facilities without delay. If we can provide any further information to facilitate this process, please do not hesitate to contact me.
