In anticipation of this potential merger, I have already contacted a local ISP that services my area and will immediately switch to satellite or rent programming. The cost of adding a new telephone line via my current cell phone provider, CREDO (a company that understands the importance of serving the community as well as themselves) is minimal. Making these changes will cost me less than my current bundle with Time Warner. I will ensure that I do everything I can to help others take their business elsewhere, also. Such amounts may be a drop in the bucket to Comcast as things stand currently; but, if enough of us are creative to find ways to take our business elsewhere, we will make a difference in diminishing Comcast's profits. I plead with the FCC not to permit this merger. This is a violation of the most important principles on which America was founded. As a government agency, the FCC must uphold these principles.
