Dear Secretary Dortch,

On August 20, 2014, Kerry Miller of Nokia Solutions and Networks and Brian Hendricks of Nokia met with Renee Gregory and Daniel Alvarez in the Office of Chairman Tom Wheeler. The discussion covered standards-essential patents and 5G, but focused extensively on Nokia's comments in Docket 14-28, the Open Internet proceeding.

Nokia shared the attached policy paper on 5G in which it notes that the Commission must be careful to not restrict potential business models that can be a tremendous source of consumer choice and value creation for the entire mobile broadband ecosystem. Nokia shared its views that the Commission should not reclassify broadband under Title II of the Communications Act and should generally take a similar approach to the one adopted in 2010 with respect to wireless services.

Nokia further articulated how specialized services, offered for a fee, could be a significant source of value creation throughout the mobile broadband ecosystem while preserving key elements of network neutrality such as non-discrimination and no-blocking. Nokia urged the Chairman to consider the need for value creation in all sectors not just among "edge" companies, including among infrastructure providers in order for innovation to continue.
