On September 11, 2014, Facebook, Inc. (“Facebook”) had the following meeting at its corporate headquarters in Menlo Park, California:

- Colin Stretch, Facebook’s General Counsel, Joel Kaplan, Facebook’s Vice President for U.S. Public Policy, Brian Rice, Director of Public Policy at Facebook, Chris Weasler, Mobile Director at Facebook, and Krista Kobeski, Associate Manager of Public Policy at Facebook met with Commissioner Michael O’Rielly and Erin McGrath, Legal Advisor to the Commissioner.

During this meeting, Facebook discussed points made in the Internet Association’s comments, filed on July 14, 2014 in GN Docket No. 14-28. Facebook has long supported a free and open Internet that is accessible to people around the world, and urged the FCC to adopt enforceable rules against paid prioritization or the creation of Internet fast lanes, so that the Internet remains an open platform for speech and commerce.
