I am writing this letter in support of ACD Telecom's request to be certified as a frequency coordinator for Part 90 public safety frequencies.

I applaud the Federal Communications Commission's efforts in promoting efficiency and competitive frequency coordination process as delineated in DA 14-1292.

Based on my experience with ACD Telecom, I will simply respond to the criteria established by FCC in 1986:

- (a) **Representativeness of the users of the frequencies to be coordinated;** I am very impressed with their speed of service and follow up emails and calls to ascertain my satisfaction with their response. In particular, I like the way they keep you in the loop with the status of the application from the beginning of the coordination until FCC grants the license.
- (b) **The entity's overall coordination plan (including how recommendations would be made and equality of applicant treatment);** ACD has always demonstrated their fairness and equal treatment. As a Chief of Police and public safety provider, I know they are very fair in their treatment of the applicants.
- (c) **The entity's experience coordinating frequencies in the service or technical expertise;** ACD Telecom staff, in particular their senior management have extensive experience in frequency coordination in public safety bands. They have RF engineers with extensive public safety background who perform frequency

coordination, that's more than I can say for other coordinators. I have been very impressed with their ability to explain technical and regulatory items in a way that is very easy to understand. They have been involved with numerous nationwide public safety projects, such as, but not limited to; National Public Safety Planning Advisory Committee (NPSPAC), National Coordination Committee (NCC), International Telecommunications Union-R (ITU), APCO Project 25 (P25).


