Woof Boom Radio owns and operates stations in Central Indiana. Our vision is to use our voice to build our communities.

We are very much in support of the FM Class C4 / 73.215 / 74.1203 Proposal filed by SSR Communications and strongly encourage The Commission to adopt the proposal. We additionally urge The Commission to include Zone II in a similar action.

Three of the stations that Woof Boom Radio operates are class A FMs. We also own and operate two AM stations with translators and a class B FM. The many communities we serve would benefit greatly by this type of proposal in our area. Typically, our stations are the only source of local news and information for the people who live and work in the small and mid-sized towns in East Central Indiana.

Adopting 73.215 / 74.1203 is a very important step that provides broadcasters the opportunity to do what they do best; deliver news and information to the local community. Subsequently, the Commission should include Zone II with a similar rule making, including protections for the class of stations licensed in II (with protection for not only A and C class stations, but including B and B1 stations, as well).

The proposal affords broadcasters the ability to reach and better serve those communities that don't have a source for local information. Most small towns no longer have the daily newspaper that covers the county fair, the school board meeting or the important decisions that are made by the town council. Local radio stations keep our communities connected. Please approve 73.215 / 74.1203 expeditiously.
