On September 16, 2014, Maggie Wilderotter, Chairman and CEO of Frontier Communications, Kathleen Abernathy, Executive Vice President, External Affairs, and I met with Commissioner Ajit Pai and Nicholas Degani, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Pai.

Frontier discussed its successes to date in deploying broadband across rural America using funding from Phase I of the Connect America Fund ("CAF"). Frontier also discussed the need to ensure that the CAF Phase II framework recognizes the costs and challenges of deploying broadband to extremely rural, high-cost locations.

Frontier also discussed its support of an open internet and maintained that regulating broadband service as a Title II service would stifle investment and innovation.
