Dear Ms. Dortch,

This letter is to advise you, in accordance with the Commission's rules, that on September 17, 2014, Chris Riley of Mozilla met with Rebekah Goodheart, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Clyburn.

The substance of our presentation was consistent with the petition submitted by Mozilla to the Commission on May 5, 2014 and comments and reply comments filed by Mozilla, all included in the above referenced dockets. We discussed Mozilla's proposal for legal articulation of a new category of telecommunications services, Remote End Point (REP) services, offered to edge providers, including general scope of the proposal and the statutory language of "for a fee" for Title II services. We presented the arguments raised in our reply comments, and in particular that the value offered by edge providers is key to driving adoption and subscription of paid access services by end users. We also discussed paid prioritization, and Mozilla's position that the Commission should adopt a presumption against such practices, and we discussed Mozilla's position that the Commission should apply the same rules to mobile services, permitting appropriate engineering practices through an exception for reasonable network management.
