Dear Ms. Dortch,

This letter is to advise you, in accordance with the Commission's rules, that on September 19, 2014, Chris Riley of Mozilla met with Priscilla Delgado Argeris, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Rosenworcel.

The substance of our presentation was consistent with the petition submitted by Mozilla to the Commission on May 5, 2014 and comments and reply comments filed by Mozilla, all included in the above referenced dockets. We discussed Mozilla's proposal for legal articulation of a new category of telecommunications services, Remote End Point (REP) services, offered to edge providers, including the scope of the REP service and proper interpretation of relevant sections of the Communications Act. We raised the issue of prioritization, and Mozilla's position that the Commission should adopt a presumption, leaving open ample opportunities for specialized services, reasonable network management, and overcoming the presumption to permit future practices where desirable. Finally, we articulated Mozilla's position that the Commission should apply the same rules to mobile services, while structuring a reasonable network management exception to permit appropriate engineering practices.
